

ENMAX Energy receives funding for carbon capture feasibility study at Canada's benchmark electricity generation facility

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Calgary, Alta. – ENMAX Energy is proud to receive funding from Emissions Reduction Alberta and the Government of Alberta for a carbon capture feasibility study at Canada's benchmark electricity generation facility for commercial-scale natural gas combined-cycle plants.

The project is one of 11 approved for funding under the Carbon Capture Kickstart: Design and Engineering funding opportunity. ENMAX is receiving just over \$3 million in funding to evaluate carbon capture at ENMAX's largest generation facility, involving highly specialized and detailed engineering assessment and design work.

The study will explore carbon capture at Shepard Energy Centre and provide ENMAX with data and insight into capture technologies and potential emissions reduction targets.
